PRAY for the people who speak Baoule. Not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord. (Romans 12:11)

**19** PRAY against the increased Internet censorship around the world so that Scriptures can be available to those who are hungry for them.

PRAY for the people who speak Bari. And the LORD, He is the One who goes before you. He will be with you....Do not fear nor be dismayed. (Deuteronomy 31:8)

20 PRAISE God for enabling a large printing of The Path to Life handout in English, Spanish, Portuguese (first time) and French. Pray that many will be drawn to life-giving truth through this evangelistic tool.

PRAY for the people who speak Bariba. It is the Spirit who gives life....The words that I speak to you are spirit, and they are life. (John 6:63)

21 PRAY that our recently relocated New Testament Bindery will be up an running soon. PRAY that our new for us booklet bindery will arrive this month. Pray that the moving of our other two booklet binderies will be quick and efficient.

PRAY for the people who speak Afrikaans.

Now to Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us. (Ephesians 3:20)

3 PRAY for Helen as she communicates with national coordinators and for Immanuel as he interacts with shipping agents, freight forwarders, and the truckers who pick up shipments.

PRAY for the people who speak Agusan Manobo.

Commit your works to the LORD, and your thoughts will be established. (Proverbs 16:3)

4 PRAY for wisdom for WMP's IT Department and Landon to keep computers operating well, free from attacks. PRAY for our consultant, Mike.

PRAY for the people who speak Ahanta.

Pray for us, that the Word of the Lord may have free course and be glorified. (2 Thess. 3:1b)

5 PRAY the World Prayer Center will be utilized effectively and efficiently. That prayer will be lifted up for WMP, for our local community, for our country, and for the world.
