and I continue depositing the gospel booklets in mailboxes several days a week*, trying to reach unsaved Japanese with the gospel."

Christians all over the world are diligently and obediently telling others about Jesus Christ. One distributor said when you approach people with nothing in your hand, they look at you and wonder who is this man and what is he

talking about? But when you can give them a booklet, they have something to look at while they listen to your story and to read after they walk away.

Gerardo uses a megaphone and a bag full of booklets as he witnesses during the morning and afternoon rush hours at Washington D.C. bus stops. People who are busy heading to or coming back from work do not want to miss their bus, but they do take Bible booklets. Gerardo prays that each seed planted will be returned 100-fold.

Ministry Starts When You Decide to Start

“We as a family have a regular life—business, work, appointments, kids’ school. You name it, we have it like any other person. We do!...But no matter what, if we go somewhere we always have the [booklets].”

Yuri and his wife, from Atlanta, Georgia, introduce their family with these words in WMP's newest documentary, *Unburdened*. Many people don't share the gospel regularly for various reasons. They might be afraid, apathetic, or lack gospel knowledge. *Unburdened* is meant to motivate and remind believers of the importance of sharing the gospel. It can easily become a daily part of life. Yuri does not plan “to do evangelism.” Whether he goes to an appointment or is pumping gas, “there are people there who need Christ. Every person matters. Give the booklets to every person.”

“The biggest challenge to witnessing is yourself. When you think this is about you, a battle is going on in your mind—what are people going to think? As soon as you say I can—not because of me, but because He is going to do it through me—it changes [your mind]. Ministry starts when you decide to do ministry.

“In evangelism, the biggest thing you need is compassion. Even Jesus Christ, every miracle that He did, He had compassion. He saw their weakness, and He was moved.

“Every second two people die, so when you understand that you could be the last resort to give the answer to those people who don't have hope, who genuinely inside their soul are looking to be saved—you cannot pass by.



“They are desperate. We have this opportunity to give to that person the message—who God [is], how to get saved, and what needs to be done. Salvation is only through Jesus Christ. This is about having those people rejoicing and seeing them led to be drawn from their sinful life.”

Yuri's story is repeated in many other countries. In Ghana, Maxwell asked himself the question, "Is getting saved all there is?" His answer was that Christians need to seek first the kingdom of God. He explains, "Scripture says Jesus went about doing good. That is one of my favorite Scriptures; so anywhere I am, I spread the gospel. In the bank, if I get the opportunity, I do it. In the taxi. Sometimes I am home and I'm like, 'Okay, let's go for a walk.' It's just because I need to talk to somebody about Christ. Before I step out, I ask God to guide and uphold me to do [His] pleasure and glorify [Him]. That is how I live. So, as I go about, I might see somebody who is hungry. 'Can you help me buy food?' I will do that, but I need to share the Word before I do that. Or, 'oh, you live in this area. I'm looking for this.' I will find a way to just drop a word. It might not be 'are you saved?' but just something to edify them. I see this as a way of life. And by the grace of God, He is helping me to keep doing that."

Alex is an international missionary who has the same passion. His desire is that "all people in the universe" would

come to know Christ. It pains Alex to know that much of the world lives in spiritual darkness.

His witnessing started in his hometown of Mumbai, and has spread to many other countries, including Saudi Arabia. Today he is in the United States praying and fasting for the two hundred volunteers that are going to canvas the entire Houston, Texas area in 50 days. They will be hanging booklets on people's doors, handing them out at universities and shopping malls.

Yuri, Maxwell, and Alex are a part of the vast network of distributors WMP has developed over the past 64 years. We estimate close to 32,000 people hand out booklets, and that number is growing. You might only order one box at a time, but when countless believers worldwide want a box, the demand quickly outweighs the supply. Pray the Lord will continue to provide WMP the resources and help increase production, so everyone has the booklets they need.
